Bellville Rodair Renames CITT Scholarship

Reposition 2008 - Winnipeg, MB - Bellville Rodair International announced it will be renaming its CITT academic scholarships after two of their founding members.

Effective immediately, Belleville Rodair's two \$1,000 academic scholarships will now be known as the Pat Cullen Scholarship and the John Chipperfield Scholarship respectively. The two bursaries were previously known as the Bellville Rodair International Scholarships.

Mr. Cullen and Mr. Chipperfield were integral in the founding and building of Bellville Rodair, and are both members of CITT. The new scholarships will be given annually to two aspiring supply chain and logistics students enrolled in the CITT Program of Study.

Jeff Cullen, president of Bellville Rodair, felt the time was right to honour two well-respected colleagues who helped to build not only Bellville Rodair, but the supply chain and logistics profession in Canada.

"The renaming of these scholarships in recognition of Pat Cullen, CITT and John Chipperfield, CITT was done to recognize the profound impact both have had on the logistics industry," said Mr. Cullen. "As entrepreneurs, partners, mentors, coaches and volunteers, Pat and John have helped shape the past, present, and future of the CITT as well as that of Bellville Rodair International, which they helped to establish."

Pat Cullen, CITT, is currently the global chairman of Bellville Rodair International. He has been with the company since its inception in 1996. Mr. Cullen previously worked for Canadian Pacific Railway and Salada Foods / Kellogg. Mr. Cullen was also a past president, honorary president, vice-president and president and COO of CITT. He earned his CITT designation in 1967.

John Chipperfield, CITT, was a founding partner of Bellville Rodair and the former vice-president. He now sits on their Canadian board of directors and also acts as a consultant. Mr. Chipperfield started his logistics career in the trucking business. He is a past chair of the CITT Board, and currently acts as the CITT's internal auditor. He earned his CITT designation in 1993.

Mr. Cullen and Mr. Chipperfield were excited and slightly taken aback upon learning the scholarships will be named in their honour.

"It is a genuine honour," said Mr. Cullen. "What makes it even more special is the fact that I have an absolute commitment to education and believe it should span the entire length of any career."

Mr. Chipperfield felt sharing this tribute with his longtime associate Pat Cullen made it even more special.

"I am totally filled with pride and appreciation," said Mr. Chipperfield. "And to be named at the

same time as my business partner, mentor, and friend Pat just tops my career.”
